2) Future events	

As TC 3.2 sponsors or co-sponsors a significant number of IFAC events this triennium, in this item we discussed events for the next triennium, 2012-2013 (2011 will be the year of the Milano World Congress and no further events can take place).

The TC is interested in sponsoring events with a larger audience and with high-quality papers. One way of achieving that, as proposed by the CC 3 Chair and by the 3.1, 3.2, 3.3 TC Chairs is to organize, in 2012, a Multi-conference (under the lines of IFAC NTCC, held in Hong-Kong some years ago), jointly sponsored by the 3 TCs under CC 3. Robert Harrison manifested the interest of the Dept. of Automatic Control and Systems Engineering, University of Sheffield, UK, to organize such an event. This was unanimously agreed.

Actions:

- A. Ruano to contact CC Chair and 3.1 and 3.3 Chairs informing about Rob's interest
- Rob to address Sheffield University about this possibility and try to link it with the Olympic Games

Regarding the next edition of IFAC AFNC, which Sam Ge had previously manifested the interest of organizing it in an Asian country, the TC discussed the problems arising of not having IFAC conference papers indexed in well-known databases, such as SCOPUS and ISI. In fact, since some years ago, papers of IFAC events are not indexed in the existing databases. Asian authors, which constitute now a large proportion of control researchers, typically choose conferences whose papers are indexed. Additionally, in terms of events organizations (and events organized in Asian countries typically have got the potential of attracting larger audiences, as the local community is larger), Asian researchers typically do not want to organize events whose papers are not indexed.

Although this has been happening mainly in Asian countries for the last years, it is the TC feeling that the pressure of having the papers referenced and cited (notice that if paper A is referenced by paper B, the authors of paper A will only be cited, according to a data base, if BOTH papers A and B are indexed in that data base) will also be an increasing requirement for western researchers.

TC Chair was asked to raise this problem to the IFAC Publication Chair, Professor Tomizuka, with a view of a rapid solution to this problem. If this will be the case, the TC agreed in sponsoring the next AFNC in 2013 in an Asian Country, provided Sam Ge is willing to organize it.
