4. IFAC World Congress 2020: short report on MMM papers by Andreas Kugi

A. Kugi thanks C. Aldrich, I. Craig, A. Desbiens, M. Hovd, D. Sbarbaro, D. Theillliol for serving as TC 6.2 Technical Associate Editors (TAEs) for the IFAC World Congress 2020. In total, 56 papers related to MMM topics were submitted und handled by the TAEs.

5. IFAC MMM Workshop 2021 in Nancy, France: status report presented by Didier Theilliol

D. Theilliol reports about the actual status of the preparations for the MMM workshop that will take place in Nancy, September 1-3, 2021, jointly organized by Université de Lorraine and ArcelorMittal. The MMM workshop proposal was approved by IFAC in January 2020.

Beside the main sponsoring TC 6.2, eight co-sponsoring TCs (2.3, 2.4, 4.2, 4.5., 5.1, 6.3, 6.4, 8.3) are involved.

The deadlines for the 2021 MMM workshop are as follows:

- Feb. 14, 2021: submission deadline for draft paper
- April 14, 2021: notification of paper acceptance
- June 14, 2021: submission of final paper version

The preliminary schedule of the workshop was prepared based on the assumption of 60 accepted papers. In the afternoon of September 2, a visit to the R&D center of ArcelorMittal is planned.

The workshop website (mmm2021.cran.univ-lorraine.fr) is under construction and will go online in September 2020.

No questions are raised. A. Kugi encourages all members of the TC 6.2 to strongly support the MMM workshop and promote it in their own country. Moreover, the excellent work of the organizing team is highly appreciated!

6. IFAC MMM Symposium 2022 in Montréal, Canada: proposal presented by Jocelyn Bouchard

J. Bouchard presents the proposal for hosting the IFAC MMM 2022 Symposium in Montréal, Québec, Canada, August 22-25, 2022. The topics of the Symposium are modelling, simulation, and advanced control, AI developments and applications, aluminum processing, automation of mining operations, and optimization of mine planning. The proposed conference location is Bonaventure hotel, centrally located and offering meeting rooms as well as guest rooms.

The symposium targets 80 attendees. In the course of the symposium, industrial tours shall be offered (e.g., Glencore Copper refinery, Glencore Zinc refinery, Rio Tinto Metallurgical Complex).
